SCHOOL BOARD DISCUSSES PRELIMINARY 2024-25 GOALS

The Minnetonka School Board held a planning meeting to discuss preliminary goals for the 2024-25 school year. The Board develops its annual goals through an iterative process, which includes reviewing the District's progress in achieving current goals, considering input and feedback received throughout the year from staff, students, families and the broader community, and monitoring student outcomes measured through assessments, activities and survey data.

GOAL: Excellence in Well-being, Connection and Belonging

The District will continue to prioritize student mental health and to create a welcoming, inclusive and safe environment for all through various initiatives. Schools will also increase bullying prevention efforts.

GOAL: Excellence in Student Learning and Support

The District will increase opportunities for improved academic outcomes for all students, improve student literacy efforts, expand student program opportunities and improve middle school opportunities.

GOAL: Excellence in Leadership and Organizational Support

The District will work to ensure long-term financial stability and sustainability, address staffing needs, assure facilities meet current and future needs of the community, provide high-quality meals for students and continue engagement efforts to foster community trust.

Excellence remains the focus here at Minnetonka Schools. Recently our School Board mapped out the preliminary 2024-25 goals for the District. The new goals build on our current ones of Excellence in Well-being, Connection and Belonging, Excellence in Student Learning and Support and Excellence in Leadership and Organizational Support—with some new action items under each area for the year ahead. While much of our District news is sunny, we are aware that there are some challenges ahead of us. Our funding from the State has not kept up with the cost of providing the exceptional education our families have come to expect, and that, coupled with the fact we have scaled back on open-enrollment growth over the past few years, means we will be facing some budget challenges. Consequently, we are looking at expenditure reductions for the first time in nearly two decades. We will work hard to minimize the impact any reductions would have on our students and staff.

As always, I want to thank you for all you do for Minnetonka Schools and for being part of this incredible community. Thank you for your continued support and for helping us to remain a district where students' dreams set sail.
